PROJECT OVERVIEW

This project renovated about 21,800 square feet of existing interior space in Harper Hall. Program requirements included replacing mechanical, electrical, plumbing and HVAC systems; upgrading furnishings and fixtures; renovating to comply with current code requirements; replacing all windows and doors, and utility improvements providing chilled and hot water for HVAC units.


PROJECT OVERVIEW

The Hill Residence Halls complex was comprised of 14 buildings totaling more than 1,400 beds. It was built between 1962 and 1967. Given the age of the Hill Residence Halls complex, the university has determined that investing in a major renovation of the residence hall buildings will not be cost effective. The Campus Master Plan has recommended that, once the Hill Residence Halls are demolished, the site house future academic buildings.

Quad Drive Infrastructure Improvements



PROJECT OVERVIEW

The Quad Drive Infrastructure Improvement project will provide new hot and chilled water supplies for Teague Hall, Little Hall and a new student housing project to be constructed at a later date, as well as piping for connection to mains on Mell Street, west along Quad Drive and future connections in the existing parking lot west of the Quad Center. Quad Drive will be converted to a pedestrian only concourse at the conclusion of the project.




An overhead view of the Quad Drive Infrastructure Improvement project.



PROJECT OVERVIEW

This project consists of a comprehensive renovation of the Hood McPherson Building in Birmingham. The building envelope and levels one through six will be fully repaired and renovated. Once complete, the building will include a communal lobby; shared Auburn University professional amenity space; College of Architecture, Design and Construction (CADC) fabrication space and studios, and Harbert College of Business Executive Instructional and Outreach space.
